
# Family Promise of the Triangle

When I joined Family Promise of the

pandemic, the question on everyone's mind

The world was changing rapidly, and we knew
that if we were going to continue to meet the needs
of families experiencing homelessness, we had to

adapt.

Over the past few years, we have answered the question of "What does the future hold for Family Promise?" We have transformed our shelter model, expanding beyond our traditional congregational network to provide innovative and flexible shelter solutions. We have introduced new and creative services that allow families to regain stability faster and with greater dignity. From Rapid Rehousing to Transitional Housing to aftercare programs, we have taken bold steps to ensure that every family in our community has a place to call home.

# From Our Program Director

At Family Promise of the Triangle, we know that every family's journey to stability is unique. That's why we've grown to offer six different programs—because one size doesn't fit all. Whether a family needs emergency shelter, transitional housing, or support to prevent eviction, we meet them where they are with the right resources at the right time.

This year, we've expanded our services in meaningful ways. Thanks to a generous donation, we now have a beautiful townhome to serve as a bridge for families moving from our Transitional Housing program to permanent housing. This welcoming space provides

families with additional time and support to secure long-term stability while living in a home environment.

We've also launched our Rapid Rehousing program in Durham County, an exciting step forward in helping even more families find stable housing quickly. By covering short-term rental assistance and providing case management, we're ensuring that families in both Wake and Durham counties can move from homelessness into a home of their own.

These expanded services mean we're serving more families in more places, but our work wouldn't be possible without the dedication of our volunteers. From providing meals to offering services, your support creates the community of care that makes Family Promise so effective. As we grow, so does our need for compassionate volunteers willing to walk alongside families on their journey to stability.

# Highlights from 2024

#### More Families in More Places

One of our generous donors purchased a 3 bedroom townhome for us to use for guests leaving our Transitional Housing program. This provides families with more time to get back on their feet and have their names on the lease to build credit. We've already placed our first family in the house and, with the support of our community, were able to provide them with reliable transportation for the next stage in their lives.

We also began offering Rapid Rehousing services to Durham County residents this year. We look forward to continuing our relationship with Durham County and providing housing for more Durham families in 2025 and beyond!

Our Emergency Shelter and Transitional Housing apartments in Raleigh have also received fantastic upgrades, including new floors, toilets, and a Little Free Library for the community.

#### Overwhelmed with Gratitude

Family Promise of the Triangle has grown rapidly in recent years to offer more services to more families in more locations than ever. We owe this growth to the vision and commitment of our thousands of volunteers from the last 30 years. In November, we had the opportunity to present two very special volunteers, Nick Verna and Elizabeth Beam, with the George and Mary Beth Deaton Volunteer Award.

2024 also saw the launch of our new Legacy Giving program. We have always been proud of our outcomes at Family Promise—especially because we strive to eliminate cycles of poverty and homelessness that can impact families for generations. Our supporters who have made the decision to leave us in their wills have made it possible for us to extend our impact even further into the future.

Our staff had the incredible opportunity to travel to Indianapolis in October for our first Family Promise National Conference since the pandemic! Aside from three days of stellar breakout sessions (including one led by our own Development and Communications Director), our staff had the opportunity to participate in a poverty simulator, giving the opportunity to have a brief, first-hand glimpse into the lives families experiencing homelessness.


